SUBJECT: Web 2.0 Capabilities and Social Networking Sites

Internet Web 2.0 capabilities, including social networking sites, have rapidly emerged as integral tools in day-to-day operations across the DoD, and in our collaboration with other federal agencies. These tools are proving valuable in areas such as recruitment, public affairs, and quality of life for our military personnel, as well as sharing information with allies, coalition partners and military families. However, as with any Internet-based capabilities, there are implementation challenges and operational risks that must be understood and mitigated.

I am therefore directing the DoD Chief Information Officer (CIO) to present to the Secretary of Defense, no later than August 31, 2009, the threats and benefits, as well as the policies and processes to ensure the responsible and effective use of emerging Internet-based capabilities. Commander, U.S. Strategic Command (USSTRATCOM) is already in the process of collecting information from across the Department to support this analysis of requirements, vulnerabilities, and risk mitigations. The DoD CIO will then develop DoD policy governing the use of Web 2.0 capabilities from a comprehensive risk management perspective no later than September 30, 2009.
